

The church will be decorated on Saturday, Dec. 14. If you would like to help, please notify Dave Johnson, or mark the attendance form. We will meet at 9 a.m.





The 6th annual Christmas Concert at the Scottish Rite Cathedral, featuring the glorious 1924 Kimball Pipe Organ will be held on **Monday**, **December 9 at 7:00 pm**. Doors open at 6:00 pm. The Scottish Rite Cathedral is located at 3633 Lindell Blvd, 63108.

Admission and parking are free, parking is available in the Scottish Rite Parking Garage around the back of the Cathedral on 3634 Olive, and entrance to the Cathedral is only available via the Skywalk located on the 3rd level of the parking garage. Note: The doors at the front of the cathedral along Lindell will NOT be open. Be sure to let the parking garage attendant know that you are with the Scottish Rite to get free parking.

Performance will be given by Keith Tomazi, staff organist. He will perform for about an hour, afterwards is an "open console" meaning that the audience is invited to come up to the choir loft to see the console, take pictures, ask questions and play it if they would care to do so. Fun Facts about the Kimball organ will be displayed during the performance. A sign-up sheet for people interested in a tour of up to two of the pipe chambers will be available.

The Kimball organ celebrated its 100th birthday in October, so this is a particularly special concert.

Every Sunday morning, Jan Sullivan and Joan Torbeck worship with other members of Atonement, but not in the traditional way. Some are Atonement members who cannot attend church regularly, if at all. Some must work Sunday morning while others stay home when they fall ill. The live stream and associated recording offer each of them the opportunity to participate in weekly worship.
